LIVELY AND CRISP DRY WHITE WINE

Saint-Bris Sauvignon Blanc

TASTING NOTES

Visual: Light golden colour with silvery glints.

Nose: Notes of citrus (grapefruit, mandarin) and exotic fruits (litchi, mango) blend with broom flower and boxwood.

Palate: Tense in the mouth and thirst-quenching with an acidulated finish.

WINE AND FOOD PAIRING

As an aperitif or to accompany dishes such as sushi, maki, spring rolls, paella, shellfish, fish, white meats, vegetable dishes or mild cheeses.

For family occasions we typically serve it with “gougères” (choux pastry with cheese) or parsleyed ham.

Serving temperature: 12°C.

WINEMAKING AND MATURING

Grape variety: Sauvignon.

Vinification: Gentle pressing at low pressure to protect the quality of the juice.

Maturing: In temperature-controlled stainless steel tanks to bring out the aromatic expression.

THE TERROIR

The only place in Burgundy that we find Sauvignon Blanc is in the Saint-Bris-Le-Vineux commune, close to Chablis in the Auxerre region. The vines source the character from the Kimmeridgian soils that they share with their prestigious neighbour. It is this terroir that gives the Sauvignon its liveliness and freshness.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Saint-Bris appellation was given official recognition in 2003 thus acknowledging the unique character of the Sauvignon Blanc planted in the area. Here in Burgundy, the homeland of Chardonnay, Sauvignon grows on only 133 hectares making it a real curiosity and well worth tasting!
